Even before government declared the State of Disaster, we have been taken from pillar to post by the National Department of Health when we inquired about its plans to implement the workplace prevention measures to protect workers. The Occupation Health and Safety Act requires employers to undertake risk assessment and inform workers accordingly. Employers are required to then rollout the health and safety measures in the workplace in order to address those risks accordingly.

Despite the lockdown, we have done all we could to reach out to our members who are facing danger at the workplace to ensure that their outcry is attended to. Managers, MECs and the Minister of Health, Dr Zweli Mkize, have all ignored us. Instead, they have been busy meeting with other elites such as business people, traditional leaders and so on, yet the fight against the Coronavirus and COVID-19 falls squarely on the frontline workers' shoulders. We are angry at the levels of disrespect, neglect and incompetence shown by the department, towards workers in this regard. In the meantime, remember your union, NEHAWU, is fully behind you, and we shall do all we can under the circumstances to defend and protect you. Let's continue with the glorious work of saving the lives of our people, especially the working class and the poor.
