### Thousands of workers rally Across South Africa to mark the World Federation of Trade Unions 79th anniversary

Workers across **South Africa** gathered in their thousands to commemorate the anniversary of the World Federation of Trade Unions (WFTU), a class-oriented trade unions federation dedicated to advancing workers' rights. Organized by NEHAWU, POPCRU and other affiliates of COSATU, these nationwide protests aimed to highlight demands for dignified working and living conditions, significant wage increases, and the right to collective bargaining, which many believe is under attack.

#### 79TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION 2024 IN NEHAWU PROVINCES



In Gauteng Province, demonstrators marched Premier's office. submitting memorandum that called for improvements in health infrastructure, building maintenance, and an end to planned worker retrenchments. workplace demonstrations Several seminars were also held in the province of Kwazulu Natal, including at Uthukela Health District, the Department of Employment and Labour in Durban, and hospitals Pietermaritzburg.



In **Mpumalanga**, NEHAWU and COSATU led similar protests, with gatherings at Riverside Government Complex, Evander Hospital, and other key sites. Workers demanded permanent employment for temporary staff, a 35-hour workweek, improved health and safety standards, and universal healthcare and social security systems, particularly for the most vulnerable populations.





In Umtata, the **Eastern Cape** province, King Sabata Dalindyebo Region, the General Secretary of NEHAWU addressed a packed hall and delivered a memorial lecture marking the 78th Anniversary.

The WFTU expressed solidarity with South African workers, vowing to continue the fight for better working conditions and protections across all sectors.

#### WFTU PRESIDENT - CDE MZWANDILE MAKWAYIBA AND NEHAWU GS CDE ZOLA SAPHETHA

The General Secretary Comrade Zola Saphetha addressed a WFTU lecture in Umtata on the occasion of its 79th anniversary. He underlined that since October 2023, Israel bombarded Gaza and the West Bank, leading to the deaths of over 44,000 Palestinians, including 16,000 children, with 10,000 people reported missing. Israeli actions have drawn widespread condemnation. Iran also launched missile strikes against Israel to avenge the deaths of key leaders from Hezbollah, Hamas, and Iran. Comrade Zola stressed the importance of ending all wars including in Sudan, DRC, Mozambique, Ukraine and that the WFTU marks its 79th anniversary by calling for peace, social progress, and an end to imperialist aggression. The "WFTU remains committed to fighting for workers' rights, dignified living conditions, and the redistribution of wealth to benefit the working class globally", he said.
